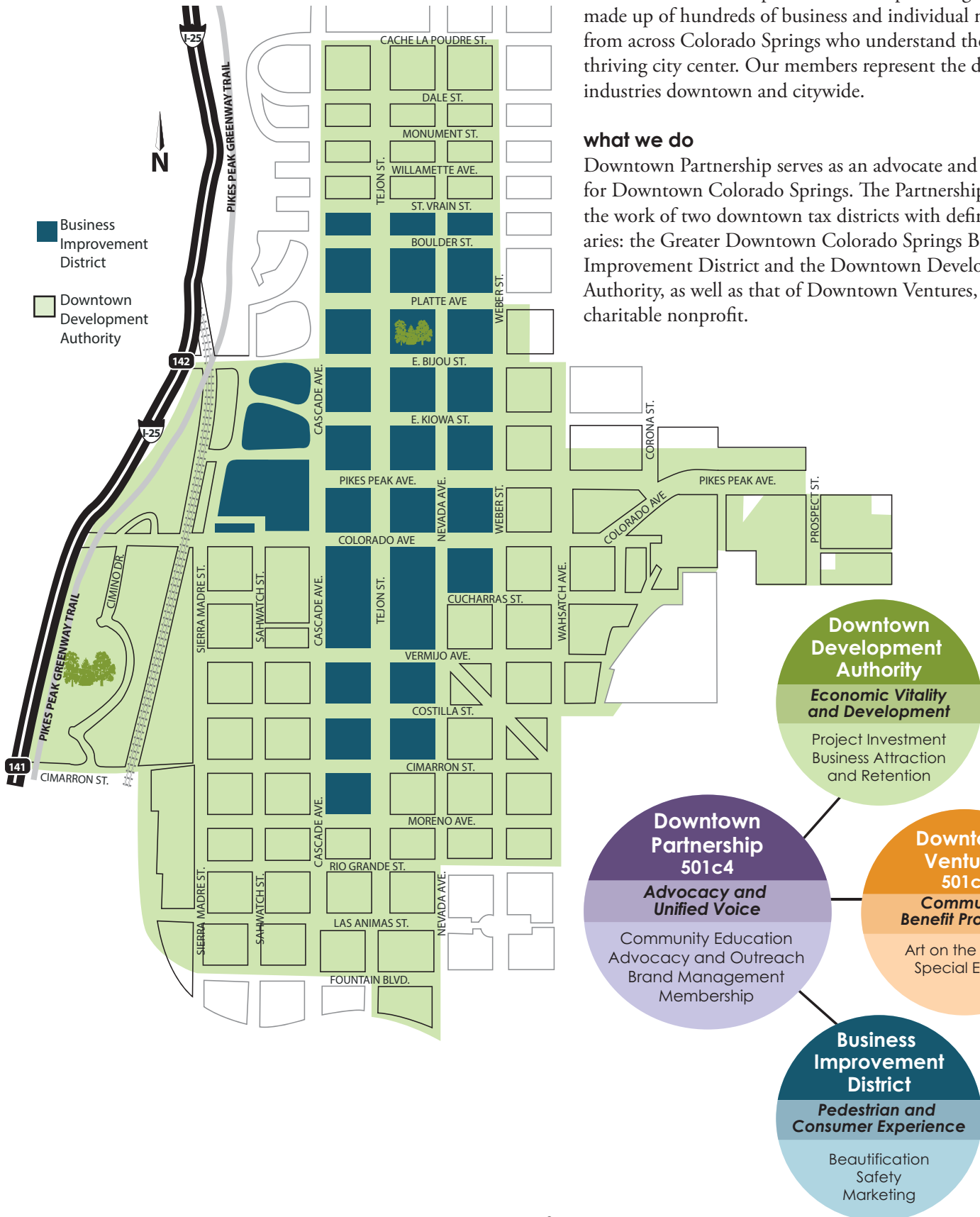
**Our mission: Downtown Partnership ensures that Downtown Colorado Springs serves as the economic, civic and cultural heart of the Pikes Peak region.**

The Partnership manages the work of two downtown tax districts with defined boundaries: the Greater Downtown Colorado Springs Business Improvement District and the Downtown Development Authority, as well as that of Downtown Ventures, a 501c3 charitable nonprofit.

Downtown Partnership works closely with city and county elected leaders, civil servants, property owners, nonprofits, and business and civic leaders to ensure our Downtown is positioned for opportunity and prosperity.

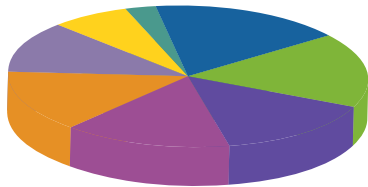
### downtown partnership areas of influence in 2015:

- Served as the leading voice of business seeking – and securing – a date certain for the closure of Drake Power Plant.
- Joined with powerful coalitions to secure funds to improve our roads and to address construction defect reform at the local level, creating a path toward attainable housing.
- Interviewed candidates for mayor and City Council and educated them about Downtown concerns.
- Reached nearly 800 people through our Annual Breakfast and four free Downtown Lowdown events.
- Educated nearly 800 people about Downtown through custom presentations to service and industry organizations.
- Worked in partnership with City staff to create an ordinance allowing pedicabs in Downtown and throughout the city.
- Connected our members through four lively Member Mixers.
- Served on boards and committees intersecting with Downtown concerns, including: Regional Tourism Act Advisory Board; City LART Advisory Committee; City Special Events Committee; Colorado Springs Pioneers Museum; Colorado Springs Fine Arts Center; Continuum of Care; CSPD Citizen Advisory Committee; Cultural Office of the Pikes Peak Region (COPPeR); I-25 Interchange Working Team; Infill and Redevelopment Steering Committee; Peak StartUp; and U.S. Olympic Museum.

Our membership experienced a 19 percent revenue growth in 2015. It is through our growing membership base that we become an ever more powerful, singular voice for Downtown.

family fun, shared activities – enlivens our city center.**

Downtown Ventures (formerly Community Ventures) works in alignment with Downtown Partnership as a charitable arm powering much of our people-centered programming.

Downtown Ventures engaged our community through 129 days of programming in 2015. That's 18 days of Downtown Sunday Market; 12 First Friday art walks; 3 Starlight Cinema outdoor movie screenings; 30 walking tours through our Core Culture series, Photography Walks and private tours; and 66 days of ice skating (2015-2016 season).

The work of Downtown Ventures is supported solely through individual donors, grants, sponsorships, fees and contracts through our affiliate Downtown organizations.

**downtown ventures' accomplishments in 2015 include:**

- Art on the Streets soared to new heights, with vinyl parrots suspended over an alley and 11 other intriguing works installed throughout Downtown, buoyed in part by a new partnership with Mountain Metro Transit.
- The number of walking and biking tours offered nearly doubled, with the addition of Photography Walks, curator-led First Friday walks, and an increase in privately scheduled tours.
- First Fridays exploded, with new venues coming on board for more than 20 participating venues, including both galleries and nontraditional art spaces. The warmer months of First Friday saw a variety of street performers adding to the evening experience.
- Skate in the Park, a partnership with the City of Colorado Springs Department of Parks, Recreation and Cultural Services, shattered attendance records with 15,178 skaters enjoying the Acacia Park rink in the 2015-2016 season.
- The popular Downtown Sunday Market wrapped up its season with the Venetucci Pumpkin Patch; children snatched up all 600 pumpkins offered in the patch!
- Hundreds turned out for our new Starlight Cinema, screening popular films on the roof of a parking garage, complete with live music, beer and games of cornhole.
- Through the Judy Noyes Memorial Purchase Fund, Downtown Ventures acquired Michael Shewmaker's eXe, continuing to add to Downtown's permanent art collection.

The BID promotes the Downtown experience through consumer marketing efforts and welcomes patrons with an exceptional pedestrian experience.

## **among our accomplishments in 2015:**

- Our Clean Team patrolled our 32 blocks seven days a week, picking up trash, tending to more than 500 issues of defacement and more than 600 instances of spills and stains. We also gave our sidewalks a few heavy-duty powerwashing treatments.
- Winter hit hard, with 17 days of major snow removal and 31 days of ice melt application (over 23 tons of ice melt!).
- With support from the Downtown Development Authority (DDA), Downtown safety was enhanced with a private security team providing extra eyes on the street, patrolling nearly 2,000 hours in the year.
- New holiday banners, red garland and bows beckoned shoppers during the holiday season.
- A new partnership with Pikes Peak Hospice and Palliative Care brought green-lit trees to planter pots for the holiday season.
- With support from the DDA, new bright twinkle lights were added to 64 trees.
- With support from the DDA, wayfinding signs received fresh paint, new lettering and new, easy-to-navigate pedestrian-friendly maps.
- 80,000 Downtown tourism maps were distributed to stores, cafés, hotels, the airport and visitor centers throughout the region.
- More than 1,500 Downtown Gift Cards were sold, bringing at least \$67,540 in sales to participating downtown stores and restaurants.
- Nearly \$50,000 in advertising, printing and negotiated in-kind media promoted shopping and dining throughout the year.
- Our new Pints & Plates promotion was a hit, partnering with local breweries to attract new patrons to Downtown eateries.
- Downtown experienced a 22 percent growth in Facebook “likes” through strategic and lively posts.
- Eager shoppers snatched up our 7,500 copies of the popular Holiday Coupon Book.
- 325 banners were hung on lampposts to promote nonprofit and civic events and initiatives.
- Our Landscape Team tended to 91 flowerbeds and 49 flowerpots brimming with blooms.

# DOWNTOWN DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

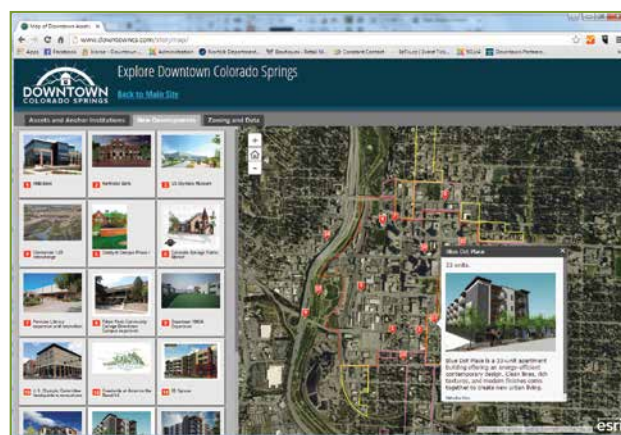
**The Downtown Development Authority (DDA) builds public and private investment partnerships that promote the physical and economic growth of Downtown.**

The DDA provides grants, special initiatives, close collaboration and involvement on city planning efforts, assistance for small businesses to maneuver the hurdles of site location and entitlements, and help for property owners to identify prospective tenants.

Of particular note, in 2015 the DDA, in partnership with the City of Colorado Springs, embarked on a significant update to the Imagine Downtown land use master plan. The update, to be completed in 2016, has thus far integrated hundreds of hours of feedback from stakeholder focus groups, charrettes, individual interviews and a community forum; plus review of data and existing reports; bicycle touring of Downtown; and applying a depth of understanding of national urban trends. The master plan update will be a significant step forward in guiding the thoughtful development of Downtown.

## among our other accomplishments of 2015:

- DDA provided direct tenant or lead support for 11 new Downtown businesses, representing nearly 35,000 square feet of leased space.
- Staff reviewed and commented on 14 cases before the Downtown Review Board.
- Eight businesses were assisted with grand openings through ribbon-cutting events and PR support.
- Our Holiday Pop Up Shop program returned, with two filled vacancies plus a tiny-house coffee shop.
- New website features include a vacancy database and a GIS-based map of anchor institutions and new developments, aiding business prospects in investing Downtown (pictured).
- Just over \$300,000 in grants were provided to businesses and ventures meeting the goals of the Imagine Downtown plan of development. Those included:
  - **Building Enhancement grants** totaling \$192,346, including grants to Poor Richard's complex (pictured), Catalyst Campus, Iron Bird Pizza, Blue Dot Place commercial property, Bonny & Read's Fresh Seafood and more.
  - **Special Project grants** totaling \$69,000, including grants for feasibility studies for bike share and the Colorado Springs Public Market.
  - **Special Event grants** totaling \$43,000, including support for GoCode Colorado, Waldo Waldo 5K and the Rocky Mountain State Games opening ceremony.
